On March 5, 2017, we were blessed to dedicate the new Family Life Center of Central Baptist Church, after nearly two years of planning, fundraising, and construction. Two years ago, God gave Central Baptist a vision to complete a building that has been decades in the making on the members' minds. The building was dedicated by holding our worship service in the facility and inviting all present to share a meal together following the time of worship. Pastor Joseph said, "this building is a thing that took all of us. It has brought us together not as a collective of individuals or co-workers, but as a team and a family. We are different now that we have labored through this great effort together. And I couldn't be more proud of you all being my church family."

The vision is to use the building to provide for much-needed educational space, to build community by hosting community events, athletics programs, school programs and other events in the space, to offer programs that meet the deeper needs of our people by ultimately introducing people to Jesus.

"In Jeremiah 29:11, God says, 'I know the plans I have for you, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.' I'd like us to consider, and be ready for the strong possibility, that something that



happens in this building might answer that prayer for somebody. This might be somebody's place of finding hope, this might be somebody's place where they realize God has a glorious future for them," said Pastor Joseph.

Already, since the dedication, we have seen those prayers forming into a reality. Sincere Worship Chason Disheroon, Minister of Music

The word sincere is often used to describe truthful, genuine actions or gestures between individuals. Often our demeanor, lack of interest, and self-involvement overshadow any sincere efforts we might attempt to make. If we were to apply this term to our weekly communal worship with God, would we like the results we find? Many Christians would appreciate never having to answer this question. The results might very well surprise and even shock some. Let us use the following scenario as an example. Sunday morning arrives, a typical family finds its way into the church minutes before the service begins. They have each come with little to no expectation for what will happen here on this specific day. Yet somehow, they feel as though they are exactly where they are supposed to be. Like many others, this family has grown up with no alternative to a Sunday church service. They continue to carry on a tradition of comfort and familiar activities. Much like someone who completes a mundane task repeatedly for the feeling of familiarity, many church members are present each Sunday with this exact mindset. They lack a deeper understanding and yearning for what truly is taking place. Can we actually honor God more by stopping our comfortable, passive participation and realigning our hearts with His? Worship should be an experience, a relationship, an opportunity, and a privilege.

Why do we worship? How much of ourselves do we put into it? Are we always true to God and His graciousness? As a congregation, we must be able to identify worship so that we can better address our faithfulness and praise to Him. Our ultimate goal is to glorify, praise, honor and please a most gracious God. According to author and speaker Louie Giglio, worship is the activity of the soul. He also makes the following statement:

"Right now, all around you, people of all shapes and sizes, people of every age and purpose are worshipingcontinually making decisions based on what they value most. Worship happens everywhere...all day long."1

With this thought in mind, as the leaders and lay people of our congregation, we must insist and encourage each of our church members to strive; creating an open, loving relationship with God that takes place not only on Sunday mornings, but throughout every single day of the week.

Giglio also suggests that we come to a worship service prepared, anticipating what is to come. As you travel to the church, cross the parking lot and enter the front doors, reflect on the experiences that are to come. "The key is to come prepared, to come worshiping." As we become changed in God's presence, we are filled in truth; we continue our journey, faithfully working on our commitment to Him through sincere, heart-felt worship.

Let our desire at CBC be to actively worship God in spirit and truth!


